

## PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

This year the SADC supported many projects in the following niche sector:

- Tourism : The SADC is a member of the Percé GeoParc and sits on the Board of Directors. Our organization manages the Economic Development Corporation (CDE) for the realization of a development project on the sites of Circuit des Bâtisseurs, Parc du Bourg de Pabos and Base Plein Air de Bellefeuille.
- Ciment plant : The SADC, with other partners, supported financially and technically the set-up of a committee to maximize economic spinoffs from the Port-Daniel—Gascons cement plant.

## **ACTION PLAN 2015-2016**



2014-2015 was a year of big changes that brought us the economic growth that was so long awaited in ou MRC. For the coming two years, SADC will sit on a committee that will give special attention to projects related to the cement plant. I would like to take this occasion to thank the people from Economic Development Canada (DEC) who contributed the major part of financing for the operating expenses of this committee.

The SADC is a member of and sits on the Percé GeoPark Board of Directors. This \$7.2 million project will have an interactive pavillion with interior and exterior games, a walkway, a camping site and trails. This new attraction will improve the Tourist offer for our MRC in 2016.

Aside from the traditional sectors, the SADC will continue to encourage development of the CIT sector, this must be at the heart of the development of our businesses, our organisations and municipal government in order to remain competitive.

We have increased our portfolio and will continue to do so due to the experience of our team and the economic growth foreseen for our MRC.

The success of our businesses is due to adequate follow-up, and mentoring is one of the tools used most frequently by our organiszation. This year Desjardins; the Caisses Polulaire; Centre-sud gaspésien and Littoral gaspésien financed our mentoring team.
