

#### WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT

Once again we meet in a general meeting to deliver a report of our economic activities in our MRC.

This year, fast drawing to a close, has allowed us to sign a new five year agreement with Canada Economic Development which will allow us to continue to play an important role in the economic development and diversification of the Rocher-Perce sector. By strengthening our territory's ability for action we also allow it to reach its peak potential. The agreement will also enable us to make long term plans on a multi-year basis, clarify our main focus and strategies and put them into action.

Whithout neglecting our traditional promoters, we will continue to focus on our upcoming new young promoters. Also, thanks to the new agreement, our « Star product », the Youth Strategy Loan has been improved and has risen from 15 to 25 thousand dollars with easier repayment modalities.

Lots of energy was spent on technical and financial assistance which allowed buy backs, the acquisition of new businesses and especially the start-up of new businesses in our area.

Local development has continued to interest us and seek our help in the establishment of many partnerships, and especially in the tourist sector, including the International Cruises and the project « Perce l'incontour-nable ».

We believe the information and communications technologies represent an important avenue for economic diversification and change and therefore we have continued to support its driving force which is the Technocentre. To achieve this attracting and training human ressources and business prospection is the launching pad which will allow for the development and consolidation of this high potential sector. This dynamic team has a list of achievements worthy of mention.

The fishing sector has also seen extraordinary results including the creation of the EPAQ's pilot project factory designed to promote the emergence of new marine products in second and third degree processing. To their honor our industrialists have extended the production period in shellfish factories and have created more collective wealth by adding value to these marine species.

Lastly, in the forest sector a developing project is creating lots of hope. Once in operation sub-contracts and processing will be possible in addition to the introduction to renewable energies of our area which remains an important and prominent priority for our organization.







# **PROJECT DEVELOPMENT**

The SADC focuses on developing projects that create new jobs in the MRC Rocher-Percé territory. The organization was involved with three projects in the forestry, tourism and information and communications technology (ICT) sectors.

**Wood transformation project :** The SADC assured the technical follow up of the Atlantic Fiber file for the town of Chandler during the time between Annick Cotton's departure and the hiring of Nadia Karina Minassian.

**Tourism :** Through the Rocher-Percé Tourisim Office, the SADC supported the implementation of the structure needed to begin « Percé l'incontournable ».

*ITC*: The SADC supported, technically and financially, the development of the pilot project Jolifish, following a partnership with Québec's Ubisoft Studio. A team of programmers, developers, and testers worked on the adaptation of video games on IPod, ITouch andt IPad.

The SADC offered technical support to the organization and also to the development activities targeted by its board of directors.

## **ACTION PLAN 2011-2012**

With the conclusion of the new agreement, the SADC is committed to draw up a detailed, long term, action plan that will be submitted to Canada Economic Development for their approval. It will include a portrait of the present socio-economic situation of the milieu as well as the issues and goals. We will establish the SADC orientations and expected results. Our annual action plans will be aimed at obtaining these results.

In this long term action plan, traditional development sectors will remain prioritized, particularly service and retail business, along with the tertiary sector. Our diversification sectors will be communication and information technologies and renewable energy.

Given the context of an aging population, the SADC has been pre-occupied by business succession over the last few years. This year, seeing the anticipated labor and entrepreneur shortage, we will place special emphasis on making our entrepreneurs aware of the importance of planning their business succession.


Another SADC goal is to increase the competiveness of businesses in our portfolio, among other things, through electronic commerce and sustainable development. We will make use of the Technocentre for Communication and Information Technologies (TCTIC), programs for internships in small businesses (PSPE), Community Access Centers (CACI) and we will develop a strategy to accompany businesses in sustainable development.

We will have a lot of work to do in the coming years to see Rocher-Percé prosper, and that cannot be achieved without the support of my Board of Directors and devoted personnel of Rocher-Percé SADC.

#### Objectives for the period of April 1<sup>st</sup> 2011 to March 31<sup>st</sup> 2012




# YOUTH STRATEGY INVESTMENT FUNDS

#### **PROJECTS DEVELOPMENT**

The SADC promotes, supports and encourages initiatives that promote community development. Three such initiatives will be the focus for the year 2011-2012.

**Information and communication technologies (ITC)** : The SADC established the Technocentre des technologies de l'information et des communications (TCTIC) in order to facilitate the emergence of businesses in this domain in our area. We will offer tehcnical and financial support for the development of this sector.

**International cruises** : The SADC offers financial support to « Escale Gaspésie » which is responsible for the promotion of the Gaspé to International Cruise Lines. It will also offer support to the Chandler and Percé municipalities for their infrastructure projects.

**Sustainable development :** The Gaspésie and the Madgalen Islands SADCs would like to set up a support project in sustainable development aimed at SMEs, social economy enterprises, and not-for-profit organizations. We want to raise awareness, train and support our business enterprises in a sustainable development process in order to ameliorate energy efficiency, waste management, use of residual substances, use of re-cyclable materials and development of better practices in human resource management. Studies have shown that these practices could improve business profitability.
