

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



### **PROJECT DEVELOPMENT**

This year, the SADC supported a number of projects, mainly in the following areas:

**TOURISM**-The SADC worked with the CDE on the URA project located west of the Circuit des Bâtisseurs in Chandler, which will be operational in June 2019. We helped upgrade the internet network at the Base de Plein Air Bellefeuille. In collaboration with the Festival Les Percéides, the SADC prepared a business plan for the establishment of an auteur cinema in Percé.

**TIC-**The SADC is working with the information and communication technologies technocentre on a pilot project to support start-ups and companies with high growth potential as part of Quebec's digital economy action plan. This project ended in December 2018.

### 2019-2020 ACTION PLAN

For more than 30 years, our organisation has been working for the development of our community, and today the economy of our RCM has never been better. I would like to think that our organisation's resources and tools have contributed to this new prosperity.

With the extension of a new 5-year agreement with Quebec's SADCs and CAEs, the federal government is showing that it is once again placing its trust in the staff and volunteers of these organisations in order to continue to support local economic development and achieve results.

As you can see, despite the reduced staff, 2018-2019 was a very good year in terms of providing funding and support for these businesses and development projects.

Our financing operations are mainly succession-related in the fishing, tourism and retail and service sectors. The latter accounts for 78% of our investment portfolios.

The SADC will continue to work with local businesses to help them innovate and adapt to changes in the new economy in order to maintain and improve the quality of their jobs. As for our development organisations and tourist attractions, the SADC will support projects that will ensure their long-term survival.

Despite the reduced staff and the retirement of Pauline, who served as our office clerk for 30 years, I consider myself fortunate to have been able to work with experienced staff such as Si Pin, business advisor, and Lisa-Ann, administrative support clerk. Unfortunately for the SADC, but fortunately for the region, Si Pin is leaving our organisation to take up a new challenge with Investissement-Québec.

With all these changes, 2019-2020 will be a year of reorganisation for our SADC in order to adapt to the requirements of the new contract and the market reality in terms of labour availability.

In closing, I'd like to thank the members of our Board of Directors, our mentors and all those who take part in the committees set up by our SADC. Their volunteer hours contribute greatly to the development of our community.

Our organisation will be monitoring the implementation of the *Axe multi-média* project in Greater Chandler in collaboration with the CDE.

**SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AND INNOVATION**: The SADC will support sustainable development projects in the MRC du Rocher-Percé.
