### YOUTH STRATEGY FUND

### REGIONAL RELIEF AND RECOVERY FUND (RRRF)

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic that has been raging for more than a year, Canada provided the SADC and CAE network in Quebe network budget envelope to create the Regional relief and recovery fund (RRRF-PDC) to provide financial support to businesses that are ineligible for other federal programs but that have suffered and are still suffering from the impacts of this health crisis.

In fact, since mid-March 2020, the economy has come to а standstill and several businesses the region have found in themselves financial in and operational difficulty. On the SADC deployed ground, publicise resources to this emergency aid and the response was positive and instantaneous: in a short space of time, we able to distribute the were entire RRRF-PDC budget to eligible businesses.

RRRF was launched in June 2020 and aimed to offer, initially, an emergency working capital loan of up to \$40,000. Although this amount provided relief for some businesses, there were some for which liquidity needs exceeded *\$40,000*. As result, а CED provided SADC the network with an additional budget SO that it could help more businesses and increase the assistance by maximum \$20,000, which in turn made it possible to grant financing of up to \$60,000.
