I'm pleased to confirm that I've agreed to be part of it, and to put in the time and energy needed to achieve the best possible outcome.

Message from the General Manager

WE'RE HERE FOR YOU!

The SADC team evolves constantly. Indicators such as team spirit, the relationship with the manager, the work environment, personal and professional development, psychological safety and personal values are all present in our organisation. It is largely thanks to the team's advanced level of connection and their mobilisation that I am able to report to you that we have achieved the various objectives of the action plan we set for ourselves at the beginning of the year.

Surpassing the \$800,000 target we established for our main line of business – financing, we invested \$912,989 in the region's businesses. Of the 20 companies supported by the regular investment fund and the youth strategy fund, 16 are new clients. In the last quarter of the year, we once again demonstrated our agility and ability to deliver a project in a very short period of time. In fact, 17 businesses and organisations benefited from non-repayable contributions totalling \$270,947 via the *Small rural tourism business support project* (SRTBSP). This project aims to support the tourism sector, which was one of the hardest hit by the COVID-19 pandemic.

In local economic development, the involvement of our mentors and the various forms of support we provide to promising community projects led to the allocation of an additional contribution of \$15,000, which was added to our annual \$40,000 contribution under the *Local intervention measure*.

Teamwork! To stand out, you have to do things differently. Thanks to the SADC's skilled advisors, we have been able to offer our clients more advisory services than ever before. Our local partnerships led to the launch of the first cohort of our ABCs of Financial Management and Bookkeeping project, with 15 people participating. Finally, the support and involvement of external resources enhanced the technical assistance services we were able to offer our clients.

For the second year in a row, we received funding under the *Green shift* program. Three projects met the eligibility criteria for 2022-2023, with contributions split almost equally between local economic development (LED) and technical assistance (TA).

I hope that I can keep the flame burning in every member of my team, and that the team will continue to support me for a long time to come as I forge ahead to build the organisation.







An amount of \$668,129 was invested in businesses located in the area served by the SADC.


INVESTMENT LEVERAGE EFFECT



Over \$4.5 million



FINANCING – Youth strategy fund



INVESTMENT LEVERAGE EFFECT



The aim of this project was to enable SADCs and CAEs to provide non-repayable contributions to support small rural tourism businesses in carrying out minor investment projects enabling them to adapt or develop their products and services to meet customer needs and so, support their development and seize opportunities offered by the recovery in tourism.


A total amount of **\$270,947** was approved for **17 enterprises**.

Local economic development (LED)

The SADC's financial contribution helps to implement projects promoting the sustainable development of our territory and the growth of its entrepreneurs and community. This component is supported by our business lines and mentoring.

Technical assistance (TA)

The tailor-made consultancy service provides businesses, including not-for-profit organisations, with support for a range of business-related issues. In 2022-2023, one of the 5 projects was the first cohort of the ABCs project, with alone provided coaching for 15 businesses.





ACCOUNTING ABCs

16 hours of personalised one-to-one coaching with an experienced consultant for small business owners (including not-for-profit organisations). This training helps participants understand the usefulness of their financial statements, measure their financial performance using data, compare their financial statements with established models, track their figures to better manage their business, and analyse projects based on their financial data.

11 enterprises took part in this training experience.



ACCOUNTING ABCs

25 to 35 hours personalised one-to-one coaching with an experienced consultant for the person responsible for bookkeeping at a small business (including not-for-profit organisations). This training will enable them to detect inconsistencies and discrepancies immediately, control cash flow (liquidity), sales invoices, expense invoices, bank statements (bank reconciliation, etc.), payroll and manage tax rebates and deductions at source.

4 enterprises took part in this training experience.



2023-2024 PROGRAM

Provide advisory services to clients, in particular through the mentoring unit and the training initiatives, the ABCs of financial management and the ABCs of bookkeeping.

For the 3rd year running, the SADC has obtained an increase in its budget to support the **practical integration of sustainable development into the regional ecosystem**. By means of a non-repayable contribution, specialist experts can be hired to provide support to businesses seeking to improve their environmental and economic performance and adopt eco-responsible practices.

In partnership with the ICT Technocentre Gaspésie-île-de-la-Madeleine and the MRC du Rocher-Percé, the SADC will be contributing financially to help 5 businesses adopt digital technologies and services, making them more competitive and boosting their sales.
